- I september 2023 kunne Global Medical Aid passe en milepæl på 300 mio. kr. i samlede donationer siden starten i 2010.

I alt doneret medicin og hospitalsudstyr for over 305 millioner kroner siden stiftelsen i 2010

HOSPITALSUDSTYR:

I andet halvår af 2023 doneredes hospitalsudstyr i 3 lastbiler à 90 m³ til hospitaler i Ukraine og hospitalsudstyr i 2 containere à 76 m³ til hospitaler i Burundi og Etiopien— i alt 422 m³ velfungerende hospitalsudstyr til en anslået værdi af ca. 13 mio. kr.

Udstyret til Ukraine blev distribueret bl.a. til Kharkiv, i samarbejde med to af GMA's mangeårige samarbejdspersoner, doktor Vsevolod Stebliuk, "a war hero", og General Major Anatoliy Mirchuck, tidligere direktør for Militærhospitalet i Kiev, nu direktør for samtlige militærhospitaler i Ukraine.

To af lastbilerne til Ukraine blev transporteret gratis af DSV, hvilket også betragtes som en påskønnelse af GMA's generelle indsats.

ØKONOMI:

Det er lykkedes at holde de stigende udgifter i øve, dels ved indgribende besparelser dels som følge af manglende kontrolrejser, som imidlertid må anses for nødvendige i 2024.

Det er tillige en forudsætning, at indtægterne fra fonde og legater opretholdes. Det forventes, at udgiften til købet af en større kassevogn vil reducere udgiften til brændstof og autoreparationer.



VÆSENTLIGE BEGIVENHEDER:

- Intet særligt at berette for 2023: lageret holdes i orden ligesom listen over udstyr ajourføres.
- Lægemiddelstyrens afgørelse, som har medført, at en 13-årig tilladelse til donation af medicin er inddraget uden varsel (medmindre omfattende og kostbare foranstaltninger foretages), vil nu blive indbragt for Sundhedsministeriet.
- Om nødvendigt vil et samarbejde om medicindonation fra et medicinalfirma i England blive etableret.
- Et mangeårigt samarbejde med Burundi vil formentlig blive afbrudt grundet manglende overholdelse af aftaler.
- Det forventes, at 2024 vil blive præget af større aktivitet.

Business as usual

A total of over DKK 305 million in donated medicine and hospital equipment since the foundation in 2010

HOSPITAL EQUIPMENT:

In the second half of 2023, hospital equipment was donated in 3 trucks of 90 m³ to hospitals in Ukraine and hospital equipment in 2 containers of 76 m³ to hospitals in Burundi and Ethiopia—a total of 422 m³ of well-functioning hospital equipment at an estimated value of approx. 13 million DKK

The equipment for Ukraine was distributed i.a. to Kharkiv, in collaboration with two of GMA's long-time collaborators, doctor Vsevolod Stebliuk, "a war hero" and General Major Anatoliy Mirchuck, former director of the Military Hospital in Kiev, now director of all military hospitals in Ukraine.

Two of the trucks to Ukraine were transported free of charge by DSV, which is also considered an appreciation of GMA's general efforts.

In September 2023, Global Medical Aid passed a milestone of 300 million. DKK in total donations since the start in 2010.

Here, hospital equipment from Global Medical Aid is received at a hospital in Kharkiv, Ukraine.

ECONOMY:

It has been possible to keep the rising costs at bay, partly through drastic savings and partly as a result of a lack of inspection trips, which must, however, be considered necessary in 2024.

It is also a prerequisite that the income from foundations and endowments be maintained. It is expected that the cost of purchasing a larger van will reduce the cost of fuel and auto repairs.



NOTEWORTHY EVENTS (continued):

Nothing special to report for 2023: the warehouse is kept in order and the list of equipment is being updated.

The Danish Medicines Agency's decision, which has resulted in a 13-year permit for the donation of medicine being revoked without notice (unless extensive and expensive measures are taken), will now be brought before the Ministry of Health.

If necessary, a collaboration on medicine donation from a pharmaceutical company in England will be established.

A longstanding collaboration with Burundi is likely to be terminated due to non-compliance with agreements.

It is expected that 2024 will be characterized by increased activity.

All equipment at Global Medical Aid's central warehouse is tested and registered, so that potential recipients can easily get an overview.
